Consider for a moment what it was that Jesus came to earth to accomplish. What was his purpose? Was it to confirm the laws and the sacrifices in the temple? Or perhaps to miraculously cure and feed thousands of people? Well, while he did these things they were not what he came to accomplish. They were only means to the real end.

Jesus confirmed the ancient laws and sacrifices but in the new law of love and with the sacrifice of his body on the cross. And while he cured and fed many he told them not to look for earthly food or worry about the things of the body.

All this was driven by the mission he had received from his Father: universal salvation! And more than that, he has given the same mission to his disciples: "preach the Gospel to all creatures" (Mk 16:15) and "baptize and teach all nations" (Mt 28:18-20).

I can't emphasize enough the importance of the mission. So many people today have no idea of the salvation that Jesus brings...and there is room for every one of them here at St. Patrick's. Let's work together to fulfill our parish's mission and watch the Lord's salvation grow!


